The Court referenced a report from the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) as evidence Suggesting the presence of a structure beneath the from the as structure beneath the demolished Babri Masjid, that was found to be non-Islamic.

An 5 August 2020, the bhumi puja for the Commencement of the construction of Ram Mandir was performed by PM Narendra Modi. The temple complex, currently under construction, is being supervised by the Shri Ram Janmabhoomi Teerth Kshetra Trust. In 22 January 2024, Narendra Modi served as rituals the Mukhya Yajman (Chief Patron) of rituals for the event and performed the Prana Pratishtha (Consecration) the temple. The Pranpratishtha ceremony was organised by the Shri Ram Janmabhoomi Teerth kshetra.

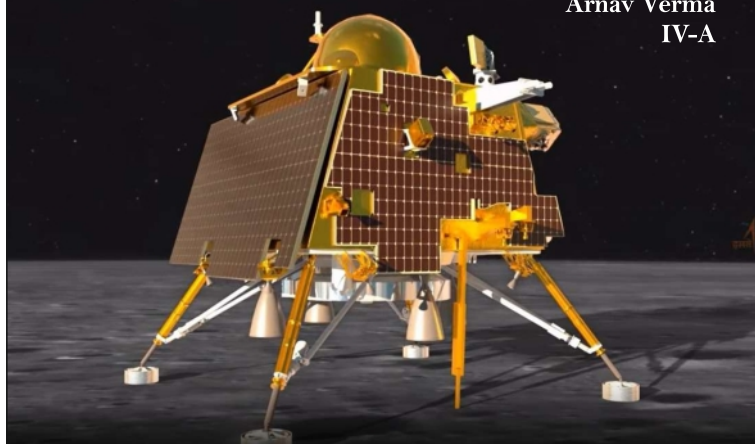
CHANDRAYAAN-3

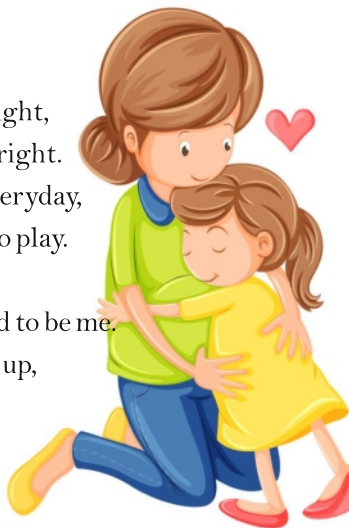

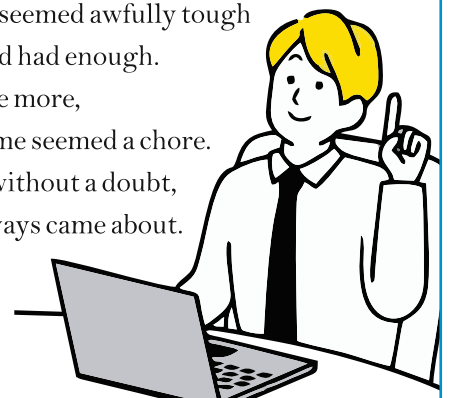
